In keeping with the objectives of the P&C, we have allocated funds raised to support important school activities. The usual allocations to Mathletics, home readers and the art program as well as literacy resources for the English curriculum and other equipment for the school continue.























# Language other than English (LOTE)

One project developed throughout this year has been exploring the introduction of a language at the school.

The present committee, chaired by Sally Rosenthal with Geoff Williams and Richard Ford, met several times throughout the year with school representatives to discuss the program, and have arranged for specialists to provide advice and brief the committee on current research and world trends. Information from other primary schools with similar programs is also being reviewed.

The introduction of such a program is not without its challenges, however the school is considering the initial information and engaging with LOTE specialists to talk with staff. The committee and school are investigating models that are used to integrate language teaching into the curriculum, and discussions about this project will continue next year. Thanks must go to the committee for leading what is a very exciting project that the P&C is proud to support.



## Life Membership.

This year, the P&C unanimously voted to award Honorary Life Membership to Mr Charles Bailey.

Charles has had a long association with the school and the P&C, notwithstanding the fact that his youngest daughter finished at the school several years ago. Charles continues to support the school and the P&C both with his generous contributions, his enthusiasm and time. The awarding of Life Membership is a small mark of recognition for the regard in which he is held within the school community, and as thanks for his support.

# Major Spending Projects.

In addition to the usual curriculum support, the P&C has been investigating two larger projects.

One project explored was the ability to redesign and extend the current basketball court. Over the course of the year, lengthy consultation occurred with contractors and relevant stakeholders. Unfortunately, several complexities have been encountered and at the present time, it would appear as though this project will not come to fruition as initially envisaged. Thanks must go to Ms Cronley for the tireless work and time which has been spent in pursuing the project. Rectification works of the current court, however, are set to proceed. The P&C is considering other ways the area may be improved and brought to the standards of the rest of the playground.

The other longer term project explored this year, has been the ability to install air conditioning into classrooms. This project will take several years, however the necessary work has begun. Because of the importance of environmental aspects, the first step will be the installation of additional solar panelling on the top of the COLA. The initial return from this will be a reduction in power consumption (and therefore bills) for the School. That project is set to get underway early next year and has been funded by the P&C. Thanks must go to Stephen Sainsbury who has been of considerable assistance in the preparation of detailed proposals and reports.

The next stage of the project is the installation of further, stand alone solar panelling which will, in turn, power air conditioning units to be installed over the ensuing years. Challenges face the project given that the school is a heritage listed building and the desire to ensure that the project meets environmental concerns. The project is ongoing and we are very excited that it is now underway.



# Second hand uniforms.

The second hand uniform shop has operated on an ad hoc basis this year when there is sufficient stock available for sale.

If you have any uniforms in reasonable condition that you no longer need, please bring them into the school office as it helps other parents, raises money for the school, and generally supports recycling.

The second hand uniform store will continue to operate in 2016 and will be advertised from time to time.
