Dear parents and carers

We have already started the term with our annual Naidoc assembly celebrating our Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander cultures and focusing on the achievements and influence of Aboriginal women on us as a community and as individuals. The students have been exploring the lives of prominent Aboriginal women and recognising the impact they have had on our community and society. The students then presented Ms Bird with a book highlighting the impact and influence she has had on the students of Newtown North and reflecting the theme "Because of her, we can...". There are more cultural experiences around the NAIDOC theme planned for the students for later in the term.

- How do we prevent bullying, prejudice and discrimination?


Fortnightly Focus on School Rules

CHESS!!


Learn to be a chess champion! Coaching for students at Newtown North Public School is held on Tuesdays from 10:50am to 11:30am, starting on 24 July 2018.
