Teacher Professional learning

A recent paper published by the Department of Education Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CECE) highlights the importance of quality professional learning and considers it one of six common key features of successful schools. Professional learning at Newtown North aims to address the professional needs of our staff, provides us with the necessary tools and expertise to implement our school plan and focuses on continued school improvement with the students at the centre of our planning and decision making.

Recently, the mathematics team have been working on problem solving and higher order thinking in mathematics and providing the opportunity for students to engage in differentiated and open ended tasks. Our maths team, led by Mr Graham will be working with the Newtown Network of Schools to further develop our teaching programs in this area.

The English team, led by Ms Sun are making an in depth study of curriculum delivery with the support of regional consultants with a focus on spelling, reading instruction and writing. We will be focusing as a whole school on the implementation and use of the new learning progressions to inform assessment and programing across the stages.

Our PBL team, led by Miss McKay meets fortnightly to review and improve the implementation and use of Positive Behaviour for Learning for all of our students and teachers. This team provides school based professional learning on behaviour, welfare and wellbeing regularly throughout the year.

As a whole staff we have been working with Glebe Public school on the use of explicit teaching strategies with a focus on quality feedback. This has currently influenced our professional reading with a focus on the work of Welsh academic Dylan Wiliam.

Thank you to our whole community for a lovely Grandparents and special person day. It was wonderful to see the whole community involved in such a special day.

This is the first year our school has entered this competition.

SRC Report

The SRC has been working on some important issues and projects this year. Last term we brought Red Nose Day and World Oceans Day to our school. Both days were a lot of fun and helped support very important causes: at Red Nose Day our school raised \$930 to go towards research into SIDS and at World Oceans Day we raised \$250 to go to Greenpeace.

Since the beginning of Term 2, the year 6 SRC leaders have been attending some special workshops with the NNOS. NNOS stands for the Newtown Network of Schools which consists of Camdenville PS, Darlington PS, Tempe PS, Newtown PS and NNPS. At these workshops we have been working with the Year 6 leaders of these other schools to develop ideas about how we can help kids feel more safe and accepted at school, foster positive relationships and reduce bullying of all kinds.
