Dear Parents and Carers,

This week the Newtown North Public School community recognised and acknowledged National Sorry Day. Guided by the resources developed by our Aboriginal Education Team and The Australian Curriculum for NSW schools, the students have spent time this week learning about the significance of National Sorry Day and Reconciliation week. Reconciliation Australia describes National Reconciliation Week as "a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia." The theme this year is *More than a word. Reconciliation takes action*.

As **NAIDOC Week** falls in the school holidays, Newtown North Public School will be celebrating NAIDOC week in Week Two Term Three (July 26-30) . Acknowledging the 2021 theme "Heal Country", a range of activities have been planned, in consultation with Education Department Aboriginal Education Consultants to provide a meaningful and educational week for our school community. Implementing our Strategic Improvement Plan

What is a Strategic Improvement Plan?

A Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) is a working document that details the steps our school will take to improve learning outcomes, and the achievement and growth of all students. To ensure continuous improvement, the Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) reflects where our school is at and how it will further improve learning, teaching and leading.

The Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP):

- is underpinned by the School Excellence Framework (SEF), SEF Self-assessments and the external validation process
- clearly identifies the expected improvement in learning, teaching and leading aligned to specific strategies, initiatives, resources and professional learning
- includes strategic directions and the improvement measures, including references to the school's
- agreed system-negotiated targets, against which your school's impact will be monitored and evaluated
- clearly reflects the department's strategic plan and Premier's priorities
- demonstrates your school's commitment to excellence and equity as part of NSW public education
- is clearly linked to the school budget, reflecting the resources that will be used to achieve the planned improvements
- is underpinned by high impact teacher professional learning to build the capabilities of teachers and school leaders.

Each term our school will engage in projects led by staff teams that will enable the implementation of our plan over the next 4 years.

Communication Guidelines

As part of our current Strategic Improvement Plan one of Strategic Directions focuses on the review and development of our systems and practices. As part of this strategic direction we are reviewing our guidelines including our parent information hand book. Our first area of review has been to refine and consolidate our <u>Communication Guidelines</u>. We have created a document that guides you through the type of communication you may expect to engage in and the best way forward when trying to seek information at our school. These guidelines also include some frequently asked questions that may assist you. We have colour coded the methods of communication from most effective (Green) to least effective or not recommended (red).
