We are delighted to note that fundraising efforts this year achieved a total of more than \$31,000. Thank you to all of those who have been generous with their time and money. The ongoing challenge is to have an engaged school community. This is necessary for us to continue to be able to fund school projects and improve the school for our children.

In keeping with the objectives of the P&C, we have allocated funds raised to support important school activities and resources. Regrettably, if fundraising activities are not well supported, many programs and facilities will be lost to students.

School Cooling Project

As many in the community will be aware the P&C has been involved – in conjunction with the school – with a long-term school cooling project. This has been immensely complicated and at times highly frustrating. The P&C has allocated significant funds (\$45,000) over the past three years so that we would have sufficient monies to address this on-going issue.

Therefore, it has been very pleasing to see Newtown North Public School identified on the Department of Education list of schools to receive centrally funded air-conditioning.

We are awaiting further details from the Department of Education before making decisions regarding the possible reallocation of the funds put aside for this project.
